GENERAL EDUCATION NOTES

Stevenson Educational Experience (SEE) courses are identified in blue.

- Students must complete all SEE and major requirements and earn a minimum of 120 credits. A minimum of 15 credits must be upper level.

*HUMANITIES classes must be from at least three different disciplines.
